But these bottlings overdeliver, coming from such heavyweight labels as Robert Mondavi, Edna Valley, Dry Creek Vineyard, William Hill and Schug.

Mondavi just celebrated its 50th anniversary, Dry Creek has passed 40, William Hill is enjoying a revival, and Buehler and Schug remain steady and reliable producers.

These widely available Chardonnays are all terrific values at 87 points and up.
